

MEETING MINUTES
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11
APRIL 12, 2005

On April 12, 2005, Chairman Rob Haney called the Republican Legislative District 11 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona-American Italian Club, 7509 N. 12th St., Phoenix, AZ.

The invocation was given by Tom Smith. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by James Nord.

Chairman Haney introduced elected officials and guests. He announced Don Hesselbrock was elected Member-at-Large of the Maricopa County Republican Committee (MCRC) on April 7th. Mr. Hesselbrock filled one of the vacancies created when Randy Pullen and Rob Haney resigned as Members-at-Large of the County Committee.

Meeting minutes for March 8th were approved as corrected.

Chairman Haney reported the MCRC golf tournament on April 2nd, at the Wigwam Golf Resort, raised approximately \$7,000.

Randy Pullen, Arizona National Committeeman and member of RNC's Technology Committee, spoke of a proposed program where each state will have its own web site. Hopefully, this program will be approved by the State Chairmen as it will greatly enhance e-mail campaigns. Mr. Pullen also gave an update as to where Prop. 200 is in the courts.

Sen. Barbara Leff spoke on the differences between her bill and the AG's bill on the purchase of over-the-counter drugs containing methamphetamine. Rep. Steve Tully spoke on the state budget bill that Governor Napolitano vetoed. The Senate and House will work on a new budget. Rep. John Allen talked about the military visitors who visited the Arizona State Capitol. Each of the Representatives discussed their votes on 3 of the 28 bills (nos. 7, 8, and 11) listed on LD/11's website.

Bill Christiansen, State Executive Director, gave an overview on the proposed plans for the State Republican Party's website. Arizona will be a pilot state. Mr. George Teegarden discussed LD/11's website and answered questions concerning voting procedures.

John Acer, 1st Vice-Chairman, introduced Kari Spencer who spoke on the lobbying efforts by the United Families concerning human cloning at the United Nations. Mr. Acer then introduced State Treasurer David Peterson. Mr. Peterson discussed the functions of the Treasurer's Office and gave a slide presentation on his Character Counts Program.
