

MEETING MINUTES  
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11  
MAY 10, 2005

On May 10, 2005, Chairman Rob Haney called the Republican Legislative District 11 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona-American Italian Club, 7509 N. 12<sup>th</sup> St., Phoenix, AZ.

The invocation was given by Rev. Wes Darby. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of American was led by Tom Husband.

Chairman Haney introduced elected officials, guests and newly appointed Precinct Committeemen. He then reported on the Executive Guidance Committee (EGC) meeting held May 5<sup>th</sup> and the State Executive Board Meeting held May 7<sup>th</sup>. Training for Precinct Committeemen (PC) will be held in the fall.

Meeting minutes for April 12<sup>th</sup> were approved as distributed.

Randy Pullen, Arizona National Committeeman, said State Chairman Matt Salmon agreed to pay \$2.00 per Republican voter registration through this coming year. This is an opportunity for our district to raise monies for its treasury. He attended an RNC state chairman's meeting in Cleveland, OH, where the Chairman and the data crew are going forward with their technology agenda. Several million dollars will be spent between now and next year to revamp all technology including each state's web site. The RNC announced \$35.2M was raised during the first quarter of this year; \$25M had been budgeted. The RNC is focusing on 47,000 more Republican registrations this year and recruiting more PC's in each district. All bills the legislature tried to pass this year on immigration were vetoed by Governor Napolitano. Pima County announced that about 50 percent of the registration they received were rejected because they hadn't been submitted with citizenship documentation.

George Teegarden, Website Master, said all PC's will have access to the district's motor vault system. The system will contain walking list data provided by the County Recorder plus data the district receives. Chairman Haney will provide ID and password information to each PC.

Don Hesselbrock, Voter Registration Chairman, asked for volunteers. The first committee meeting will be held at his home on Tuesday, May 17<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 p.m.

Sen. Barbara Leff spoke on school choice, marriage penalty and how the Governor didn't keep her promise with the Republicans on the state budget. Rep. Steve Tully and Rep. John Allen each spoke on the state budget.

John Acer, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice-Chairman, introduced Michael Jeanes, Clerk of the Superior Court, who spoke on the various functions of the Clerk's office.

Mr. John H. Jarvis introduced a Resolution in Support of the Patriotic Minutemen of Border Control Fame. The resolution was seconded by Charlotte Reed and unanimously passed.
