

MEETING MINUTES  
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11  
SEPTEMBER 13, 2005

On September 13, 2005, Chairman Haney called the Republican Legislative District 11 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona-American Italian Club, 7509 N. 12<sup>th</sup> St., Phoenix, AZ.

The invocation was given by Rev. Wes Darby. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Elaine Gangloff.

Chairman Haney introduced elected officials, guests and new Precinct Committeemen (PC's).

Chairman Haney reported the following: (1) Pennsylvania legislatures (House and Senate) recently passed themselves a salary increase at 2:00 a.m. to \$81, 050; (2) members of the Eastside Chairmen's monthly meeting discussed who is running for governor and voter registration; (3) Senator McCain answered immigration and embryonic stem cell research questions at his meeting with the Mesa and Gilbert PC's; (4) members of the Maricopa County EGC meeting on September 1<sup>st</sup> heard (a) Secretary of State Jan Brewer speak on voter registration and of her difficulties getting Prop. 200 enacted and passed by Governor Janet Napolitano and Attorney General Terry Goddard and (b) Senator Kyl; (5) Marc Young and his daughter Joanna will provide their services to make free LD/11 PC ID badges for those PC's who complete a PC data form - otherwise ID badges will cost \$5.00; (6) Linda Barber, State Education Chairman, will provide PC training at LD/11's October 11<sup>th</sup> meeting; (7) a quorum was met at the September 13<sup>th</sup> meeting with 82 PC's present; (8) August 9<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes were approved as distributed; and (9) Treasurer's Report is provided on LD/11's web site.

Andy Yates, Arizona Voter Registration Coordinator, reported the Party's official registration kick-off date to register voters for the 2006 election is Saturday, October 1<sup>st</sup>. The State Party Bounty Program will pay \$2.00 for each new Republican registration. Mr. Yates provided sign-up sheets for those wishing to help with this program.

Chairman Haney spoke on the National Federation of Republican Assemblies Convention held in Scottsdale, AZ, on September 2-4, 2005. Many national Republican speakers spoke at this convention. Members of LD/11 who were recognized at the convention were John Acer for providing legal assistance for Prop. 200, Randy Pullen for Prop. 200, and Gene Reed for Prop. 200.

Senator Leff spoke on the U.S. Supreme Court's recent decision on eminent domain. The Arizona Constitution provides protection of private property. To help stem identification theft Senator Leff is backing legislation forcing reduction of private financial information. Representative Tully said leaders of the Senate and House are working now on legislative programs for next year's session. He is going to Yuma on Wednesday with members of the legislature to review a new system the Marines are using to track illegal immigrants entering into Arizona.

First Vice Chairman Acer introduced guest speaker Don Goldwater, candidate for Governor. Mr. Goldwater addressed issues of illegal immigration, property taxes, and education.

Mrs. Marne Haney introduced a Resolution in Opposition to the Use of Federal Tax Dollars for Embryonic Stem Cell Research to be Offered for Approval. A substitute motion by John H. Jarvis passed 54 yes and 36 no. The motion reads: We, the Precinct Committeemen of District 11, urge our congressional delegation to oppose the use of tax dollars for embryonic stem cell research. No vote was taken on the original motion.
