

MEETING MINUTES
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11
DECEMBER 13, 2005

On December 13, 2005, Chairman Haney called the Republican Legislative District 11 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona-American Italian Club, 7500 N. 12th St., Phoenix, AZ.

The invocation was given by Tom Smith. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Christy Marshall.

Chairman Haney introduced elected officials, guests, and political candidates.

Chairman Haney announced: (1) LD/11's representatives received kudos for being Friends of the Tax Payers: Senator Leff with 73%, Representative Allen with 82%, and Representative Tully with 73%; and (2) Skip Rimza is running for Secretary of State, Len Munsel has an exploratory committee for Governor, and Randy Graff is a candidate for Congressional District 8 - Congressman Kolbe isn't seeking re-election.

Chairman Haney introduced Chairman Jeff Greenspan and Tom Husband who have organized a campaign called S.T.O.P (Stop Taxing Our Property) to defeat a Phoenix bond issue of \$880,000,000 to be voted on March 16, 2006. Mr. Greenspan asked for donations to help respond to seven questions which will appear on a voter pamphlet. Cost will be \$250.00 per question. Randy Pullen is Treasurer of S.T.O.P.

Randy Pullen, National Committeeman, spoke on three issues before the RNC: (1) war in Iraq; (2) border security and immigration – a Resolution Demanding the Securing of Our Borders Against Foreign Terrorists, Illegal Aliens and Other Criminals will be presented at the State Mandatory Meeting on January 28th and a more elaborate resolution will be presented at the RNC meeting on January 19th; and (3) education – petitions are available through Marne Haney for the “First Class Education for Arizona Act” to be voted on at the 2006 election.

Chairman Haney announced a quorum of 61 PC's at this meeting. Meeting minutes for September 13th, October 11th, and November 8th were approved as presented. Treasurer's Report is provided on LD/11's web site. Mr. Haney presented name badges to those PC's who submitted their PC questionnaire.

Voter Registration Chairman Hesselbrock announced the State Party will pay \$4.00 per registration during the month of December, and the County Meeting will be held January 14th at the Sun Dome in Sun City West. Business to be conducted at this meeting will be election of five members-at-large and proposed bylaw changes and resolutions. Proxies should be completed by those PC's who are unavailable to attend.

Representative Allen said he is looking forward to next year's session and that he has visited LD/11 voters. Representative Tully said he will be working on next year's budget.

First Vice-Chairman Acer introduced guest speaker Jan Flores, candidate for Governor. Mrs. Flores spoke on immigration issues, education, taxes, and appointment of judges.
