

MEETING MINUTES  
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11  
FEBRUARY 14, 2006

On February 14, 2006, Chairman Haney called the Republican Legislative District 11 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona-American Italian Club, 7500 N 12th Street, Phoenix, AZ.

The invocation was given by Rev. Wes Darby The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Adam Driggs.

Chairman Haney introduced elected officials, guests and candidates. Chairman Haney: (1) thank LD/11 PC's who helped with the County and State Mandatory Credentials Committee; (2) announced elected members to the State Committee are John Rutledge ( First Vice-Chairman), Matt Tolman (Second Vice-Chairman), Paralee Schneider (Third Vice-Chairman), Debbie Lesko (Assistant Secretary), Paul Haas (Assistant Treasurer), Alberto Gutier (Sergeant-At-Arms), and Billy Bridwell (Asst. Sergeant-At-Arms), (3) state bylaw change to give each District Chairman a vote at State Board Meetings did not pass; (4) five LD State Committeemen were appointed to replace those who had moved out of the district, (5) George Teegarden received an award at the State Dinner for Outstanding Volunteer of the Year, (6) LD/11 outstanding volunteers who received a certificate at the Lincoln Day Luncheon were: (a) Tom Husband, Volunteer of the Year, (b) Alan and Laurie Bird and Vicki Hansen, Rookie of the Year, (c) Didi Allen, Steve Erker, Jeff Greenspan, Beverly and James Kraft, Carol and Jim Nord, Meg Looney, Pat Smith, Carol Santiago, George Teegarden and Mark and Adel Young PC volunteers of the year, (7) Members-At-Large elected at the County Meeting were Don Hesselbrock (LD/11), Dan Nichols (LD/4), Jean McGrath (LD/12), Mudassar Kahn (LD/7) and Ken Going (LD/12); (8) County bylaw changes were (a) an elected member of the legislature, an employee of the national or state party cannot serve on the EGC, and (b) the EGC has the authority to rule on any question on the interpretation of the county and state bylaws.

Second Vice-Chairman Don Hesselbrock spoke on voter registration. Mr. Glenn Hammer said the State has extended the \$5.00 voter registration fee through March. Mr. Hesselbrock announced his candidacy as a member for the House of Representatives in LD/11. Mrs.. Beverly Kraft and Mr. Adam Driggs also announced their candidacy for the House of Representatives in LD/11.

Marne Haney, County First Vice-Chairman, announced: (1) Senator Kyl was the guest speaker at the Lincoln Day Luncheon on February 11th with almost 400 people in attendance; (2) the County has taken on the task to help Randy Pullen gather petition signatures for the "First Class Education for Arizona Act" initiative, and (3) the County is helping Bill Montgomery, Attorney General Candidate, collect \$5.00 donations and petition signature

Rep. John Allen spoke on his bill for \$5M to send troops to Arizona's border I and his education bill to build a college for educating 20,000 to 30,000 students. Sen. Barbara. Leff spoke on the border security bills before the legislature.

Randy Pullen spoke on his RNC meeting. His resolution on illegal aliens was defeated.

A quorum was not present so meeting minutes were not approved. Treasurer's report is on the LD/11 web site.
