

MEETING MINUTES
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11
SEPTEMBER 5, 2006

On September 5, 2006, Chairman Haney called the Republican Legislative District 11 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona-American Italian Club, 7509 N. 12th Street, Phoenix, AZ.

The invocation was given by Rev. Wes Darby. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by James Kraft.

Chairman Haney introduced guests, candidates and elected officials. Chairman Haney reported: (1) the Republican Party is conducting a Voter Vault Data Training Class for PC's on September 14th at the party headquarters, starting at 11:30 a.m.; (2) the Party will pay \$10 for each new registered Republican voter from August 3rd through October 9th, and the monies will go to the appropriate legislative district; and (3) Mr. Pederson has spent \$8.3M of his personal money opposing Sen. Jon Kyl.

First Vice-Chairman John Acer introduced guest speak Alan Korwin, is an expert on the gun laws of the United States and authored a book entitled The Gun Laws of America. Mr. Korwin explained gun laws which passed the Arizona legislature and those which Governor Napolitano vetoed. Mr. Korwin is in favor of an Arizona Gun Safety Law Class, which would educate young people on the use of guns.

Ms. Kara Karlson, Arizona Republican Party Field Representative, thanked those PCs who volunteered to help with the Party's Operation Groundswell Program. She also needs a volunteer to be a coordinator for LD/11.

Vice-Chairman Acer introduced Basilio "Bas" Aja, member of the Arizona Cattlemen Assn. Mr. Aja spoke on Prop. 204, Humane Treatment of Farm Animals Act. Mr. Aja said Prop. 204 is Hogwash and discussed why to vote NO. Prop. 204 is promoted by animal rights activists from New York and Washington, D.C.

A quorum was not present. The June 13th, July 11th, August 8th and September 5th meeting minutes will be presented at the September 5th meeting. The Treasurer's Report is posted on the district's website.
