

MEETING MINUTES  
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT I I  
FEBRUARY 13, 2007

Chairman Rob Haney called the February 13th meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona-American Italian Club, 7509 N. 12th St., Phoenix, AZ.

The Invocation was given by Rev. Wes Darby. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Dave Demland.

Chairman Haney introduced elected officials and guests. He announced Tom Husband is selling tickets for the Lincoln Day Luncheon to be held March 17<sup>th</sup> in Sun City. Cost is \$30 per ticket. Presidential candidate Duncan Hunter will be the TN'T speaker on February 24th. Cost is \$100 per person or \$125 VIP reception and dinner. The November 28, 2006, minutes were approved as presented. Chairman Haney thanked Elaine Gangluff, Tom Husband and George Teegarden for helping Chairman Pullen with the transition at State Party Headquarters. He said John H. Jarvis will be going on a church mission to Japan and will be gone for 1.5 years.

Chairman Haney introduced Lyle Tuttle, Chairman, Maricopa County, who spoke on the goals and plans for Maricopa County. These goals and plans include: (1) raise \$132 per precinct; (2) open an East Valley office; (3) provide PC training; (4) work with state leadership to win elections in 2008; (5) proactive planning to better serve you; (6) have a chairman in each district; (7) support more Republican Clubs in the county; (8) find candidates for local, non-partisan races; (9) promote use of electronic communications; and (10) be more visible and accessible to your district activists.

Randy Pullen, State Party Chairman, thanked LD/11's State Committeemen for their support and votes at the Statutory Meeting on January 27<sup>th</sup>. He spoke of his goals and plans to build party unity, raise funds, help with city elections, find good congressional candidates, and hire a Finance Director and a Communications Director. Mr. Pullen has hired Sean McCaffrey as the State Executive Director. He is forming a Nominating Committee of eight, a State Committeeman from each Congressional District, to make recommendations to the State Executive Board to replace him as National Committeeman. Replacement must be a State Committeeman. TN'T will ask presidential candidates to be guest speakers with Sen. John McCain being the last speaker in 2007.

Senator Leff reported she is working on bills to keep Social Security numbers off public websites, DNA time limitations, and County Recorders can remove invalid property liens. She is sponsoring the Teenage Graduated Drivers Act. Representative Driggs said over 800 bills are being heard in committee.

Chairman Haney reported that LD/11's bylaws require an audit after an organizational election. This audit was conducted by Tom Husband, Marc Young and Rob Haney, with Treasurer Teegarden present. Both LD/11's records and the banks match.
