

MEETING MINUTES
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11
JUNE 12, 2007

Chairman Rob Haney called the June 12th meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona American-Italian Club, 7509 N. 12th St., Phoenix, AZ.

The Invocation was given by Patrick Todd. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Phyllis Gross.

Chairman Haney introduced elected officials and guests. He reported Mr. Bruce Ash was elected RNC National Committeeman replacing Randy Pullen at the quarterly State Executive Committee meeting on June 9th. A quorum of 63 PC's was present. The meeting minutes for March 13th, April 10th, and May 8th were approved. The Treasurer's Report is posted on LD/11's website.

Rep. Adam Driggs spoke on Federal immigration laws concerning business licenses.

Chairman Haney asked State Chairman Pullen to speak on the State Executive Committee meeting. He said Mr. Bruce Ash from Tucson was elected National Committeeman. Chairman Pullen's primary focus will be fundraising. At this time the state is about \$70,000 ahead of this same period in 2006. Goals for this year will be recruiting new PC's, candidates and training. On June 23rd GOPAC will hold a training session at the State Party Headquarters. LD/11 is a targeted district.

Chairman Haney introduced Steve Lory, candidate for Mayor of Phoenix. Mr. Lory's issues are illegal immigration, violent crime, create a city ethics committee, tax rebates, light rail and city budget.

Mr. Tom Husband, Voter Registration Chairman, said he and Mr. George Teegarden are working on new ways to register new voters within LD/11

Chairman Haney introduced Jon Altman, candidate for Phoenix City District 3. Mr. Altman's issues are strong neighborhoods, a safe city and a fiscally responsible government.

Chairman Haney introduced Jack Watson, candidate for Phoenix City District 3. Mr. Watson's issues are illegal immigration, additional police officers, remove tax rebates and create a city ethics committee.
